

In ♣♠ (Ghabaray) there are four pure vowels. † (a'), ♠ (ha) silent, ↑ (wa), ♣ (ya), and • (gha). Below we will go over the sounds and rules of Ghabaray.

† (a') is a short (a') sound. If the † is the first letter of a word and the next letter is a vowel it is silent. If † is at the end of a masculine word it is silent, and if the † is at the end of a feminine word it is heard.

(ha) is a silent vowel placeholder when in the middle or end of a word.

Yabashah (dry land)






1 (wa) is always a long o vowel when in the middle or end of a word. Example: Wo (hook)





1 (ya) is always a long ay vowel when in the middle or end of a word.
